Databases for Scholarly Publications

Anthropology Plus

Citations for journal articles, reports, commentaries, and edited works, in social, cultural, physical, biological, and linguistic anthropology, ethnology, archaeology, folklore, and material culture. Includes records from Anthropological Literature (Harvard University) and the Anthropological Index (Royal Anthropological Institute). Late 19th c. to date.

Fuente Academica

Fuente Academica provides scholarly journal articles in Spanish covering many academic areas including business & economics, medical sciences, political science, law, computer science, library & information sciences, literature, linguistics, history, philosophy and theology. This database covers 260 scholarly Spanish language journals from respected publishers worldwide. 1922 to date.

Handbook of Latin American Studies

An annotated bibliography of articles and books on humanities and social science topics. 1936 to date.

HAPI: Hispanic American Periodicals Index

Citations to articles, book reviews, documents, and original literary works about Central and South America, Mexico, the Caribbean basin, the United States-Mexico border region, and Hispanics in the United States. 1970 to date.

Historical Abstracts

Index to thousands of academic journals covering world history (excluding the US and Canada) from 1450 to present, in over 40 languages, with full-text available. 1955 to date.

MLA International Bibliography

Index to books, essays, and journal articles on modern languages, literatures, folklore and linguistics. Topics include literary theory, criticism, folk literature and belief systems, linguistics, semantics, translation, dramatic arts, and history of printing and publishing. Covers literature worldwide and includes materials in all genres and in foreign languages. 1926 to date.

Music Index Online

Covers topics concerned with every aspect of the classical and popular world of music. 1979 to date.

RILM Abstracts of Music Literature

Comprehensive music bibliography providing international coverage of music literature. 1800's to date.
