## **Finding books**

**OBIS:** materials held by Oberlin College Libraries

**OhioLINK:** statewide catalog of 89 colleges and universities; self-service borrowing; items generally arrive in 3-5 days and circulate for 3 weeks with up to 6 renewals

#### **Examples of relevant subject headings:**

#### Library catalog primary source keywords

correspondence, diaries, early works, interviews, manuscripts, oratory, pamphlets, periodicals, personal narratives, sources, speeches, letters, documents

→ also use date limiting in OBIS to limit to 1920s-30s

#### Johns Hopkins Guide to Literary Theory and Criticism

Explanations of concepts in literary theory and criticism, with bibliographies

Print: Main Reference PN81 .J554 2005 LIBRARY USE ONLY

The Encyclopedia of Literary and Cultural Theory / Wiley-Blackwell, 2011

Contextual essays on theorists and schools of thought, with source bibliographies

### Finding journal articles in Databases

<u>ABSEES</u> (American Bibliography of Slavic and Eastern European Studies) -- scholarship on all aspects of Eastern European life and culture

Art Full Text – articles in art, architecture and art history journals

<u>Film and Television Literature Index</u> articles from both popular media (i.e. *The Village Voice, The Nation*) as well as film-specific publications (i.e. *Cineaste, Filmmaker*). Primarily in English.

**<u>Historical Abstracts</u>** Journal articles in world history

**Humanities International Complete** Wide range of journals covering humanities disciplines

<u>MLA International Bibliography</u> -- MLA Bibliography (produced by Modern Languages Association) is the most comprehensive index to books and articles published on languages, literatures, folklore, and linguistics; includes literature from all over the world and covers research back to 1926 in all languages

PsycINFO – Index to articles in psychology and related fields, back to 1890s

# Finding early 20<sup>th</sup> century sources

<u>Periodicals Archive Online</u> - Full text access to hundreds of journals in the humanities and social sciences. Dates of coverage: 1802-2000

JSTOR – full-text archive of selected scholarly journals in all disciplines, usually back to first issue

**New York Times** (1851-2012)

**Times of London** (1985-2009)

<u>ArtStor</u> - Over 1 million art images selected to support research in art history from pre-history to contemporary media

Search for books in **OBIS** (use advanced search to limit by date)

PsycINFO (back to 1890s) / MLA Bibliography (back to 1926)

## Other resources and research tools

<u>Google Scholar</u> - Search engine of articles and books produced by google with publisher cooperation

Journal Finder Search by journal title to find what access Oberlin has in online and in print

<u>Kanopy</u> – streaming video service, the library subscribes for campus. Titles are listed in OBIS, but you can also search the Kanopy site
