I. GENEALOGICAL RECORDS/ FAMILY HISTORIES

(Materials are arranged alphabetically by family name.)

Box 1

Acton Family, 2003

"Descendents of Edward Harker Acton and Yeoli Stimson Acton" (enr. 1903-05, con; 1905-06, Academy). Consists of a twelve-page typescript copy of a genealogy list, with index, of the Acton Family. Prepared by Emily Acton Phillips, 2003. [Acc. 2003/062]

Adams Family, n.d.

Genealogy of the Adams family, who settled in Wellington, Ohio in 1823. Includes three individuals who attended the Oberlin Collegiate Institute and Oberlin College: Helen Jennette Adams (Mrs. Simeon W. Windecker), 1859 lit.; Celestia Blinn Adams (Mrs. Arthur C. Ires), enrolled 1855-62; and Mary Ann Adams (Mrs. Charles Conkling), 1839 lit. Compiled by Arthur Stanley Ives. [Acc. 2002/146]

Ainsworth Family, 1997

"Ainsworth Family: Stories of Ainsworth Families of Rock Island County, Illinois, 1848-1996." Compiled by Robert Edwin Ainsworth. (Typescript 150 pages, indexed)

Allen, Otis, 2001

Draft of "The Descendants of Otis Allen" an excerpt from "Descendants of Josiah Allen and Mary Reade," by Dan H. Allen. Also filed here is correspondence with the Archives.

Baker, Mary Ellen Hull, [ca. 1918?]

"For MHB: A Remembrance" by Lois Baker Muehl [typescript; 64 pp; n.d., c. 1981?], received from Phil Tear, February 1, 1983. Story of Mary Ellen Hull Baker (AB 1910), wife of Arthur F. Baker (AB 1911) and mother of Robert A. Baker (AB 1939) and of Mrs. Muehl (AB 1941). Oberlin matters are dealt with on pp. 25-28 and 30-31. For Robert's death, see pp. 49-51. [Acc. 1983/4.]

Bartlett, Nathaniel Bradley, Family, 1989

Nathaniel Bradley Bartlett lived in Oberlin prior to the Civil War and was involved in the abolitionist cause. The documents here consist of a copy of the Bartlett genealogy and lineage chart; a copy of a letter of Nathaniel Bartlett, 3 October [1863?]; a copy of a survey from the Treasury Department completed by Bartlett; and correspondence of Gary Bartlett, 1989 (descendant).

Bennett, Leonard P., Family, ca. 1982

"Recollections," (79 pp.) by Leonard Parker Bennett (AB 1916). Includes information about his family, life in Oberlin, c. 1896-1916 (pp. 2-18), Camp Pemigewassett (pp. 59-60), Ramsay R.R. (p. 65), death of Oberlinian Henry Jones (p. 69) and Bennett's life in the newspaper business in Miles City, Montana, and Maumee, Ohio.

Bull Family – See Swift Family

Calvert, Robert, Jr., 2004

An American Life: An Autobiography and Family History, by Robert Calvert, Jr. (Oberlin Class of 1947). Published by Garrett Park Press (Garrett Park, Maryland), 2004. Typescript, 244 pages.

Chapin Family History, 1983

Prepared by Mildred Locke (Mrs. Almon J.) Chapin and containing copies of letters, published writings and photographs of family members plus text by M.L.C. Information clusters about Almon Chapin, his son William H. Chapin (Oberlin College Professor of Chemistry), and his son Almon J. Chapin. [Acc. 1983/31]

Cravath, Samuel Austin, 1901

Two copies (carbon and ribbon copies) of Samuel Austin Cravath's (d. 1917) autobiography written in 1901. The first forty-five pages contain family history, travel to Oberlin from Conneaut, life as a student (A.B. 1858), and winter term teaching experiences. Cravath studied medicine and practiced in Springfield, Ohio. He was a newspaper editor and bank president in Grinnell, Iowa. [Acc. 73 and 1982/011]

Fairchild, Henry, 2003

Typed copy of "Henry Fairchild: Civil War Veteran, 1838-1893" (83 pages, with copies of illustrations). Compiled in February 2003 by Marcia Beach Outcalt. Primarily consists of information concerning the life of Henry Fairchild (i.e., civil war military service, pension claim for disability due to military service, and his family). Also consists of brief biographical information for members of the Fairchild family (i.e. James H. Fairchild, uncle of Henry Fairchild).

Fairchild, Mrs. James H., n.d.

Genealogical chart of the families of Mr. and Mrs. James H. Fairchild (Mary Fletcher Kellogg), n.d. Includes original and a photocopy.

Farnsworth, Margaret Stimson, Family, 1995

Family history by Margaret Stimson Farnsworth (O.C. 1938) titled *The Stimson-Farnsworth Connection* (1995). Contains references to Charles Martin Hall family and Shansi Missionaries.

Finney, Norton Jameson, 1989

Graphic presentation by Winifred Redall detailing genealogy of Norton Jameson Finney, according to a letter to Norton Finney from his stepmother, Rebecca Rayl Finney (Finney's third wife). Letter is a photocopy of original, which Redall had been trying to return to the family. [Acc. 1990/103.]

Box 2

Frost, Wm. Goodell, [1910]

"Family Stories for My Younger Relatives" by Wm. Goodell Frost (1854-1938; A.B. 1876, B.D., M.A. 1979), written at Brighton, England, March 1910. Photocopy of a typescript including reminiscences about Frost's time at Oberlin as a student (1873-79) and Professor of Greek (1879-92). Also contains accounts of Frost's experiences as President of Berea College in Berea, Kentucky, 1892-1910. Includes an appendix "Religion in England in the Time of Edmund Frost." [2002/055] (Edmund Frost sailed to America in 1635.)

Gladieux Family History, 1974, 1978, 1982

"The Descendants of John Peter Gladieux" (133 pp., 1974) and "The 14th Indiana Light Artillery Battery" (39 pp., 1978) by Rolland J. Gladieux (AB 1931). [Family history, Civil War information and genealogy, printed.] Also his "Battery H 1st Ohio Light Artillery in Virginia, 1864-65" (1982). Received from the author, February 28, 1979.

Hall/Patterson/Brooks Family Geneology, n.d.

Graphic genealogical chart (photostat) beginning with Andrew Patterson, 1685, and including Charles Martin Hall. Gift of Charles C. Braman, 7-3-1956.

Box 2 (cont.)

Hopkins, Joel Willis, Family, 2002

"The Descendents of Joel Willis Hopkins" compiled by the Oberlin College Development Office, 2002. Includes names of Oberlin College graduates (Hopkins, Whitaker, Bent, and McCord) and a genealogical chart. There are fifty-one Oberlin graduates and former students included in this family tree.

Ingraham, Jarrett, Family, 2006

Genealogy of the Jarrett Ingraham family compiled by Larry Heald. Includes the Ingraham, Heald, and Penfield families. Typescript, 20 pages, with endnotes.

Johnson, Phineas, Family, n.d.

"Story of an Oberlin Family" by H. Edmund Stiles (A.B. 1841). Account (photocopy) of the Johnson family, descendants of Phineas Johnson, who settled in present-day Elyria in 1819. Includes genealogical tables.

Box 2

Koehler Family - see Woodruff, Mabel Koehler

Long, John, Family History, 1990

A published history of the family of John Long. Long was enrolled in 1857-58 in the preparatory department, as was his wife, Rachel Robinson (1856-58) and three of the Long brothers.

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Box 2 (cont.)

McEwen, Robert, Family History, 1991

A published history entitled, *Robert McEwen: Scottish Exile to American 1685, and His Descendants in the Line of His Grandson Gershom McEwen, Junior, of Winchester, Connecticut*, compiled by Patrician Ann Hoagland McEwen. George Faber McEwen's half-sister, Samantha Joslin, attended Oberlin College (1844-46 lit.), as did her nieces, Helen and Cora Joslin.

Monteith, John, 1973, 1975 (2 folders)

"Notes on the Life of John Monteith, 1788-1868," copy of a paper written at Princeton Theological Seminary by W. H. Cowley about this Elyria resident and follower of C. G. Finney. [Acc. 278]. Also included is a copy of a typescript manuscript (11 pages) titled "A History of John Monteith and Monteith Hall," by Betty L. Bergman, 1973.

Munger, Asahel, and Samuel Hoisington Families, ca. 1823

Munger and Hoisington family genealogical information. Copies of pages from a Bible found in the Oberlin College Library, June 1981. Moved to RG 28, Former Students File.

Olds, Baldwin and Diantha Family, 1963

"The Family of Baldwin and Diantha Olds" (109 pp.) by C. Burnell Olds (B.D. Oberlin 1911); includes photographs.

Pease, Peter Pindar, n.d.

"Genealogy of Peter Pindar Pease of Oberlin, Ohio" by Harriet A. Southall (Mrs. George Southall). Taken from *A Genealogical and Historical Record of the Descendants of John Pease, Sen.*, by David and A.S. Pease (Springfield, Mass.: S. Bowles, 1869).

Smith Family, 1997

Book titled *Early Clintonville (and Grove City) and the Bull and Smith Families* by Pendleton, Nancy, 1997. Several members of the Smith family attended Oberlin in the 1830s-40s. [Acc. 1997/103]

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Box 3

Strange, William Wallace, 2009

“Freedom for All’: Sgt. William Wallace Strange, USCT Veteran of Lorain County, OH and Father of Three Oberlin Alumni,” by Harryette Mullen.

Swift Family Record, 1830-1926

Genealogical information about the Osband Durgee Swift family. Mary Osband Swift (Cons. 1885) married Frederick Anderegg (A.B. 1885; mathematics professor, 1884-1922).

Vincent, James, Family, 1978

"The Invincible Vincents," compiled by Merrily Cummings Ford (40 pp.) re the family of Mr. and Mrs. James Vincent (Mary Sheldon, Lit. 1852; 1850-53 prep.). Includes information about Tabor, Iowa, where the Vincents took part in anti-slavery activities and James edited the *American Nonconformist*. Includes information by and about the Vincent children. Note: This item is protected by copyright.

Will and Goulet Family, n.d.

“She came from Spirit River,” by Gabrielle Goulet Will. This book contains accounts of the Will and Goulet family, including homesteading at Spirit River in Canada, n.d.

Woodruff, Mabel Koehler, 2001

Mabel Koehler Woodruff (1907-1997) and Her Family by Kay W. Bigglestone (2001). Biography of Mabel Koehler Woodruff, with genealogical information on the Koehler and Woodruff families. [Acc. 2002/89]

Box 1

Henry O. Brown, 1835-36

Consists of letters (4) of Henry O. Brown (enr. prep 1834-35; enr. College, 1835-36). Three of the letters were written to S.A. Hitchcock of Marshall, Oneida County, New York (4 July 1835; 4 August 1836; 24 September 1836), The fourth letter was addressed to Mr. P.B. Glaven (?) of Langerfield, Oneida County, New York, (3 June 1835). Henry O. Brown wrote about his experience as a student at the Oberlin Collegiate Institute. (originals and photocopies)

Rebecca A. Child, 1836

Letter to her grandmother and aunt telling of her trip from New York to Oberlin and of her illness and medical care for six weeks to the time of her writing on January 6, 1836.

Ann Eliza Gillett, 1838

Letter from Ann Eliza Gillett (enrolled 1832-42 Oberlin Collegiate Institute, Preparatory Department) to Charlotte E. Fenner, dated 5 January and 15 January 1838. Gillett wrote about her student days at Oberlin, and events near Niagara, New York, in 1838 [4 pages, folded]. Also included is a transcription of the letter [4 pages]. Original stored vault – locked cabinet.

Samuel Sedgwick, 1836

Samuel Sedgwick (A.B. 1840) to "Esteemed" friend, August 19, 1836. Letter describes his residence of more than a year in Oberlin and teaching in Sullivan in the winter. Photostat and typescript copies, 2 pp.

Elizabeth R. Lord, 1839-1900 (2f)

Materials of Mrs. Elizabeth R. Lord, student, 1837-38, 1840-42, and staff member in the Oberlin College Women's Department, 1884-1900. Consists of seven letters, 1839-1876, and miscellany, including information concerning Alice Welch Cowles, fugitive slaves and the Norton case, 1842, Giles W. Surtleff raising money for salaries, 1876-1881, and the Ladies' Hall fire, 1886. See list of materials in folder one. [Acc. 80]

Lory Andrew Barnes, 1840

Letter from Lory Andrews Barnes (enr. 1839-40, 1843-45, Lit. from Keesville, NY; d. Austin, Minnesota, April 20, 1897) to her aunt, Miss Irenah H. Andrews, describing her life in Oberlin. Original encapsulated and accompanied by photocopy. Acc. 1992/34. Gift of Karl Augenbaugh (A.B. 1924).

Rev. William Patterson Russell, 1841

Letter written by Rev. William Patterson Russell (1812-1880) to his brother-in-law Daniel Rockwell (b. ca. 1806) in Saratoga Springs. Dated 10 January 1841. The letter concerns a death in the family and other family matters, and Russell's work as missionary for the American Missionary Association.

Frances Lord Church, 1841-65, 1890-91, 1943

Records collected by Frances Lord Church (OC 1863). Includes correspondence 1841 (typed copy), 1865, 1943; student expenses 1865, 1890-91; and Spencerian Commercial Institute, 1859.

John Todd, 1842

John Todd, of Oberlin, to Mrs. Margaret Strohm, February 21, 1842. Todd (A.B. 1841, Sem. 1844) writes mainly about the anti-slavery movement and why it must go on, explaining his ideas in passionate terms. ("If to clothe the naked, feed the hungry...and deliver the poor from the hands of the oppressor be 'Conspiracy', I glory in such conspiracy.") Excellent example of the emotion of the issue. Gift of Henry L. Lieske, March, 1981.

Sarah Jane Willard, 1842

Letter from Sarah Jane Willard [Mrs. Sereno Wright Streeter] (enr. 1842-44 lit.) of Oberlin, OH, to her father, John Willard of Wilton, ME, dated 7 July 1842. [Acc. 1993/082]

Daniel Osborn, 1842

Letter by Daniel and Charity Osborn and William and Priscilla Grisell (children of Daniel Osborn) of Oberlin to Daniel Osborn of Bennington, Ohio dated 25 August 1842. [Acc. 1998/107].

Box 1 (cont.)

Charlotte Hickox, 1843

Charlotte Hickox, Oberlin, to "My dear niece," November 12, 1843. Student's letter tells of devoutness of Oberlin, the Graham system for good health, that C. G. Finney is a "harum-scarum fellow," and other information about the school. Original and typed copy plus correspondence with donor.

William Larison, 1845

William Larison (student) to Archibald Stinson, 26 July 1845. Larison writes of his school days and Oberlin. [Acc. 2015/053]

Lucy Stone, 1846

Copies of items by Stone received from various sources. Includes a composition given before the Ladies Literary Society and several letters.

David Todd, 1846-47, 1864

Reference Use Only – Do Not Copy

Letters between David Todd (oc 1843; d. 1874) and Charlotte Farnsworth (enr. 1846-47; d. 1847). Correspondence concerned classes, family, politics, and Farnsworth's health. [These are photocopies of letters and transcriptions received from John Hoffman, Illinois Historical Survey, University Library, University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. The original letters are filed in the Todd-Farnsworth Collection at the University of Illinois.]

John Meyer, 1847

Three letters (copies) written by John Meyer (A.B. 1853) while a student at Oberlin in 1847-48. In a portion of each letter, Meyer relates a bit about the College in a manner that allows his enthusiasm for life to show through. Gift of Charles M. Snyder, 55 Maple Street, Mifflinburg, PA 17844.

Phillips Sisters, 1847-56 (2f)

See RG 30/394

Phillips sisters: Edith, Hannah, Philena, and Sallie (or Sally) Phillips were enrolled in various departments in Oberlin between 1852 and 1855. Letters written by them from Oberlin, 1851-53, give vivid descriptions of their travels from their home in the East to Oberlin, of their living arrangements in Oberlin, of friends and faculty and student life in Oberlin. A number of letters written by some of them, not from Oberlin, cover dates from 1847 to 1856. There is also a folder of Essays and Orations, dated 1852, 1854, n.d., chiefly by Philena. At least one was spoken before the Ladies Literary Society. A folder of correspondence with Mrs. Pratt, donor of the letters and grand niece of the writers, provides information about the Phillips sisters and their family.

Helen Cook, 1848

Helen Cook (Lit. 1846), Oberlin, to Lucy Stone, October 30, 1848 (photo and typed copies): tells of her troubles with the Principal of the Women's Department, Mary Ann Adams; of her complaint brought before the Faculty, and news of others. A disjointed letter by one not then enrolled. Copied from microfilm Roll 66 of the Blackwell Family Papers, Library of Congress. Gift of Marlene Merrill, 3/14/1984.

John B. Upton., 1851-58

Expense book kept by student John B. Upton, 1851, and seven items mainly regarding his honorable dismissal from Oberlin College, 1852-58. [Acc. 1978/4]

W.D. Patterson, 1853

W.D. Patterson (Oberlin) to William Patterson, original handwritten letter, 31 January 1853. Portions of the letter concern John Langston and former slaves boarding at Oberlin.

Box 1 (cont.)

Edgar Ward, 1853-54

Eleven letters of Edgar Ward (typescript copies), 1853-54, who was probably a student in the Winter School. They describe living at the J. P. Bardwells, Oberlin in general, school work, blacks, and the like. [Acc. 285]

Ebenezer B. Hayes, 1856

Original and transcription of one letter from E. B. Hayes to Seth Hayes, Burg Hill, Trumbull County, Ohio, on April 14, 1856, regarding the school term at Oberlin. [Acc. 2009/047]

Henry Payson Kinney, 1856

An original note dated 7 November 1856 by student Henry Payson Kinney at Oberlin. Payson's note is written to future readers about an ambrotype portrait of Kinney, fellow Oberlin student Samuel Swifin Burdette, and G.C. Towbridge of the Kansas Territory taken 7 May 1856. All three were followers of John Brown in "Bleeding Kansas" that summer. The note was folded and stored inside the ambrotype case (ambrotype stored in RG 32/3 Cased Images). See both the ambrotype, this note and a transcription in the *Oberlin and the Civil War* digital collection published by the Oberlin College Archives, June 2012.

William Kincaid, 1858, 1861

Photocopies of originals and transcriptions of letters to Kincaid's parents and a newspaper editor. Also included are copies of class songs, This does not appear to be the same William Kincaid, Class of 1865.

Box 1 (cont.)

Sarah M. Merion, 1858-65

Merion Letters, 1858-65. Fifteen letters, written by Sarah Maretta Merion (Mrs. Vincent) and her sisters, Lydia A., Hannah Rebekah, and Mina R., to their family, reporting the trip from home (1858) to Oberlin, studies, living arrangements and regulations; of S.M.V.'s search in 1861 for a teaching position and of her return to school in 1862 in Oberlin and the departure of Oberlin men for military service. She also writes her sisters about fashions in clothing, about illness in Oberlin, and about expenses. The 1865 letter tells of the marriage of "the President and Mrs. Rayle" and of Mrs. Dascomb's disapproval. Six of these letters were received by the College prior to 1967.

Thornton B. and Sarah Ingraham Penfield, 1858-1866

Transcriptions of "Letters from Jamaica, 1858-1866: Thornton Bigelow Penfield and Sarah Ingraham Penfield, Missionaries of The American Missionary Association," compiled by Charles G. Gosselink, October 2004. (Typescript, 161 pages) [2004/085] Published version, 2005 (225 pages); 2 CD-ROMs. [Acc. 2005/069]

Charles Langston, June 8, 1859

Handwritten letter from Charles Langston to Benjamin Coates, concerning his involvement in the trail of the Oberlin-Wellington Rescuers.

Emma Townsend, 1860

Emma Townsend to "Dear Nettie," 14 September 1860. Townsend writes about Oberlin College and feeling homesick. [Acc. 2015/053]

"Fanny," 1862

"Fanny" to "Dear Sister," original handwritten letter concerning her sister's birthday and war news, Oberlin, Ohio, September 10, 1862. [Acc. 1999/100]

Box 2 (cont.)

George W. Keyes, 1863

George W. Keyes (A.B. 1864) to Friend Clark, August 28, 1863. Keyes arrived here June 1, 1862. He describes the Commencement of 1863; tells of making picture frames for an income and of being a member of a volunteer militia company. ALS and typescript copy.

Box 3

Ruth and Juliza Taylor, 1863-85

Letters connected with Ruth S. Taylor (1863-66 Prep.) and her sister Juliza E. Taylor (1866-68 Prep.), 1863-85, n.d. (c. 36 items). At least 8 letters were written from Oberlin and tell of family affairs, burials in Westwood Cemetery, and some school matters. The family was from North Rose, N.Y., so most information concerns that area. There are some Civil War related letters, particularly one from Virginia, 7/1/1865. For list see folder. NOTE: Ruth became Mrs. William L. Brown and Juliza Mrs. John Gordon Reed. See RG 28/1 Alumni Files, Boxes 33 and 211 respectively. [Acc. 1978/21]

Alice Strickler, 1865

Eight letters and replies September-October 1865, between preparatory students Alice Strickler and Alpheus E. Gregory. Miss Strickler initiated the correspondence under the name of "Ettie Leavenworth" but Gregory soon discovered her identity. The letters tell something of student relationships in the period. [Acc. 1978/30]

Thornton B. and Charlotte Penfield, 1866-1871

The Missionary's call: The Correspondence of Thornton and Charlotte Penfield, edited by Susan C. Davis (A paper submitted in partial fulfillment of the requirements for the degree of Bachelor of Arts at Kalamazoo College, Winter 1983). Consists of transcribed letters of Thornton Penfield (Oberlin College, A.B. 1856) and his wife Charlotte, during their missionary work in India from 1866 to 1871 (typescript, 587 pages). Includes acknowledgement and introduction.

Penfield Correspondence, 1866-1872

Only for Jesus: The Penfield Correspondence, 1866-1872, revised edition, edited by Charlotte E. Mertz (Silver Bay, NY: Boat House Books, 2011). [Acc. 2012/061]

Henry E. Peck, 1867

Henry E. Peck, Minister to Haiti, to the Secretary of State, January 7 and May 31, 1867 (copies); tells of the death of his daughter, Peck's attitude toward his work in Haiti and some of the problems he faced.

Eliza Burns, 1867

Two letters to her cousin, Mrs. John Clarck, of Lowell, Mass, on April 12 and November 9, 1867, regarding family and illnesses. See Acc. 2009/047.

Isaac W. Russell, 1867-68

Papers of Issac W. Russell, A.B. 1869. Consists of 23 items, 1867-69, including letters written by John S. C. Abbot (2), Bishop Thomas M. Clark, Frederick Douglass, John B. Gough (2), Josiah G. Holland, John G. Saxe (2), and Moses Coit Tyler (2). The letters concern the possibility of these persons lecturing in Oberlin and also include J. A. Sladden and Elizabeth R. (Mrs. Theodore) Tilton.

“Daniel to Ella,” 1872

Original letter from “Daniel to Ella,” 14th _____ 1872. Last names unknown. Letter received by President Marvin Krislov from Judith Green, March 2011. Correspondence in RG 2/14.

Conrad Matter, 1877-89

See **IX. Account Books** for letters and accompanying account book, 1877-89, of Conrad Matter (A.B. 1858) relating to expenses incurred in educating his children at Oberlin.

Mary E. Betts Family, 1878-1892

Louise Hill, 1889-93

Louise Hill (Ph.B. 1894): letters written to her mother, 1889-90, including one telling of the suicide of President King's father; one sent by her classmates while she was ill in 1893 at her home; some poetry and prose by Miss Hill and classmates, and a few cards and announcements.

The letters were written for the Medical Missionary Review, 905, 1908-09, and were originally filed in the Class Letters Collection, 1891 folder (College Genera). The letters contain accounts of missionary work in Zululand and Durban, Natal, and the efforts to provide medical care and build a hospital. (14 pages)

Letter (copy) written by freshman Ethelyn Unholz, January 15, 1911, in which she describes Oberlin and the daily life of a student.

Letters concern Yejiro Ono, donor of the Newton Scholarship in memory of Professor James K. Newton, who aided Ono during his student days at Oberlin, ca. 1884-87.

John Prindle Scott, 1925-27

Includes four letters (1925-27) to Mrs. Wayne B. Wheeler; also musical score for "Love is a Riddle" (words by Reginald Vivian Darow, music by John Prindle Scott). [1976/018]

Margaret G. Hammaker, 1925-47 (2f)

Margaret Hammaker, a missionary teacher in India, attended Oberlin College (1918-20), graduated from the Oberlin Kindergarten Primary Training School in 1923, received the B.S. degree from Columbia University in 1932, and attended Oberlin's Graduate School of Theology, 1939-40. Hammaker taught at Youngstown, Ohio from 1923-25 and then served as a teacher and principal at the Mary B. Harding Kindergarten Training School, Sholapur, India, 1925-64. There are 61 letters (1925-63) written to "Friends" from India telling of events at the school, of trips taken, calamities of nature, of cities visited, of holiday celebrations, and the like. Written November 13, 1861 from Camp Dennison, Ohio; November 20, 1863 from Chattanooga, Tenn. just before battle; and June 13, 1864 from Lytle Barracks, Cincinnati before being sent to Washington, D.C.

James D. Cook, 1864-65

Copies of eight Civil War letters, written by a private of Battery H, First Ohio Volunteer Light Artillery, near Petersburg or City Point, VA. Letters make reference to Stephen W. Dorsey, an Oberlinian and Captain of the Battery. Gift of Roland J. Gladioux, June 1977.

Graphic presentation Poster made by Winifred Reddall detailing genealogy of the letter writer and recipient. The writer is College President Charles Grandison Finney's third wife. [Acc. 1990/103]

Photographic copies of agreement (3 April 1840) for John Brown to act as the agent for Oberlin College's Virginia lands, and six letters from Brown about the Virginia lands. Letters are dated 2 Apr. 1840, 14 July 1840, 18 Aug. 1840, 2 Jan. 1841, 5 Feb. 1841, and 26 March 1841.

Autographed letter signed from Lewis Tappan, New York, to Robert B. Parsons, Flushing, Long Island, New York, 17 February 1848. Acc. 2009/035 [Original and copy – Researchers use the photocopy].

Norman B. Dedoether, 1851

Autographed letter signed from Norman B. Dedoether, Troy, New York, to Hamilton Hill, 16 January 1851. Mentions Philo B. Stewart. [Acc. 2012/074]

Jacob Berg Family, 1853-71 & n.d.

Jacob Berg, a Bavarian coal miner, brought his family to American in 1854 and purchased a farm in the German settlement three miles northeast of Oberlin. Jacob died in 1858. In 1894, Jacob's widow, Elizabeth, was still living. Also in that year, sons Charles, Jacob, and John were living in or near Oberlin and daughter Catherine (Mrs. James McIlrath) resided in Oceana County, Michigan. John Berg (1842-1907) became a stone mason. He served from 1862-65 in Company C, 128 Ohio Volunteer Infantry. In 1868, John married Mary Griem of Amherst Township and the couple lived on a farm in Russian Township. John became well known locally as a mason and contractor. Oberlin College recognized his skill as foreman over the building of the foundation of Council Hall by awarding him an engraved Waltham hunter case watch. Further information about John Berg is with the letters. (cont.)

Jacob Berg Family, 1853-71 & n.d. (cont.)

All of the 31 letters are electrostatic copies. All are written in German. None have been translated. Nineteen of them were written at Johnson's Island, Sandusky, Ohio, where the 128 OVI guarded Confederate prisoners of war. A few of the letters are by John Berg, but the authorship of most of them has not been determined. Two of the remaining letters were written at Cleveland (1861) and at Folly Island, South Carolina (1864). The letters are owned by Karen Schrader, 14571 Baumhart Road, Oberlin, whose husband is a descendant of John Berg. The copies were made with Mrs. Schrader's consent on March 13, 1985. [Acc. 1985/13]

John Brown, 1857

Letter written by John Brown to "Brother and Sister Adair," 16 February 1857. Brown wrote about Kansas and his plan to go there "quietly," and he inquired about their opinions of the situation in Kansas and in the nation. Original and photocopy. (2f) [Acc. 2001/131]

D. W. Manchester, 1858

Letter from D. W. Manchester, 29 October 1858 to "Dear Cousin Eugene." Included in the letter are details about the scene in Wellington, Ohio on 13 September 1858, where John Price was detained by slave catchers in the Wadsworth Hotel and then rescued. Details about a fire in Wellington on that day are also mentioned. [Acc. 2008/7].

James Monroe, 1861

Envelope addressed to James Monroe, U.S. Consul, Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, issued 1861. Also postmarked November 21, 1863. [Acc. 2012/074]

Patrick R. Nohilly, 1864

Letter written by Patrick R. Nohilly to Mrs. J. Pomeroy, October 6, 1864, concerning the Civil War and the 1864 Presidential Election. Accompanied by copy of an explanatory letter from Don Miller. [Acc. 1997/99]
